Groups Sermon Guide

Revelation 19:6-20:15; Psalm 23

- → Remember that groups are a place to practice what is preached in community with God and one another.
- → Pray together for the Holy Spirit to open your eyes to behold wonderful things (Ps. 119:18) as your group meets with the Lord.
- → Invite some group members to read

 Revelation 19:6–20:15 and Psalm 23

 out loud; assign sections to different
 members and remember Revelation 1:3 as
 you read: Blessed is the one who reads
 aloud the words of this prophecy, and
 blessed are those who hear, and who keep
 what is written in it, for the time is near.
- → Consider this quote from Eugene
 Peterson: "The Lord presides over a
 meal as a host; a war has rendered all
 enemies powerless to harm. Psalm 23
 and Revelation 19 are companion pieces
 in the exposition of salvation, showing
 forth the two elements: rescue from the
 catastrophe of the shadow of death;
 hospitality at a table where we are made
 whole with the intimacies of goodness
 and mercy." How have meals been healing
 for you in your walk with God? How can
 this help us imagine shalom peace?

- → We continue to see worship of God as central to victorious Christian life. How has your practice of worshiping God been affected in the last two years? Since beginning our sermon series in Revelation?
- → What is one life issue you are facing that you hope to approach more confidently, peacefully, and joyfully as a result of our time in Revelation together?
- → What is a way our group can live more in light of this victory Christ has won for us? What images from Revelation can inform this?
