CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY ACTION (CCA) - KIDS EAT FREE PROGRAM

TVC has committed to supporting the CCA Kids Eat Free Program. We need four volunteers each week to be responsible for counting and organizing meals and packing VBS Activity Packs to be ready for distribution to the Kids Eat Free sites. Each site has specific meal requirements, so volunteers will be responsible for organizing meal boxes and activity packs by site. They will also load the food into the Delivery Team's vehicles for distribution.

WIDOWS & ORPHANS

FOSTER AND ADOPTION BABYSITTING & RESPITE CARE CERTIFICATION

When foster/adoptive parents have a family emergency, need personal time, or just need a break, they depend on certified providers for babysitting and short-term care for their foster children.

Is God calling you to serve our body in this area? At this training, you will receive Texas CPR and First Aid training, in addition to all other training and orientation necessary to be an approved provider. There is no cost to attend the training, but to complete your certification you must submit to fingerprinting and background check at a cost of \$37.75.

This event has an age requirement. You must be 16+ for babysitting and 21+ for short-term care.

Located in the heart of Lewisville, Broken Halos Haven is a grief getaway for young widows and their school-age children, but their ministry does not stop there. When widows are thrust into managing their homes alone, the household projects their husbands could've tackled now sit on a growing “honey-do” list. That's where the Honey Dudes come in! On designated dates, we'll swoop into a widow's home to knock out some of those daunting tasks. From repairing drywall, mulching, moving storage boxes, repairing furniture, electrical and plumbing, organizing garages, and simply inflating bike tires for her kids—you name it—we'll try to tackle it!

DIRECTION 61:3 will walk alongside older foster and aged-out youth to provide a network of support as they transition to become vibrantly independent young adults. The goal is for youth (ages 15–22) to discover God’s specific purpose and direction for their lives while being fully supported in our resident and non-resident programs. There are so many ways to serve

- **Meal Train** - Provide a meal or snacks for the weekly Tuesday night THRIVE group, week-night meals for homes, or other special events. This can be a one-time or monthly.
- **Maintenance Team** - Help with the ongoing maintenance and landscaping of our facilities. This team shares in maintaining all D61:3 properties and is accomplished from an as-available scheduling process.
- **Kingdom Cars** - Direction61:3 takes donations of vehicles. Our Kingdom Cars team members are skilled in auto-mechanics and work to repair cars for designation to youth when they complete their proficiencies.

Giving Grace is a local nonprofit that provides relationships and resources to address the underlying causes of homelessness and housing instability. They currently have needs for coaches, childcare, community engagement, and event hospitality. These can be one-time or longer-term service opportunities. Consider joining them every third Saturday of the month for a Love First Work Day at their land in Denton from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. Volunteers will assist with cleaning up branches, picking up trash from pathways, etc.
