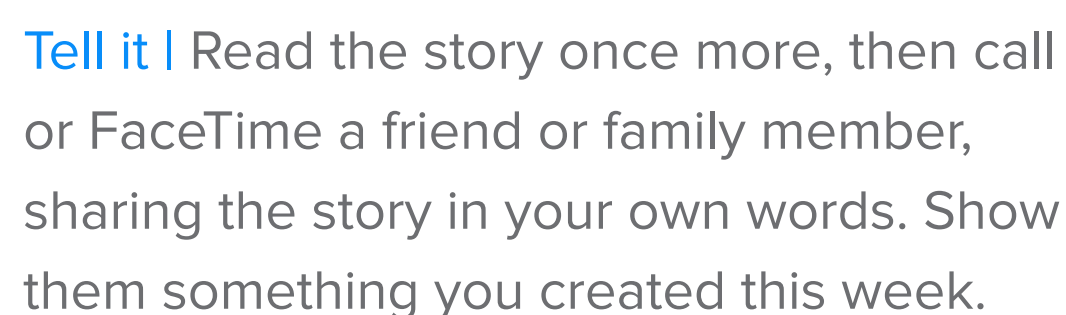
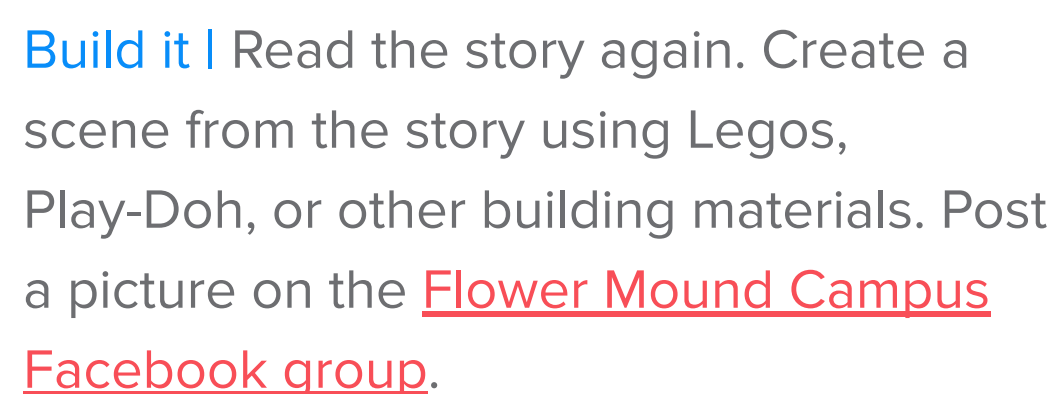
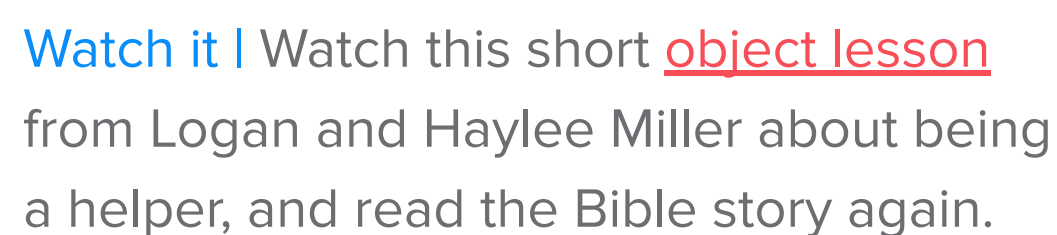
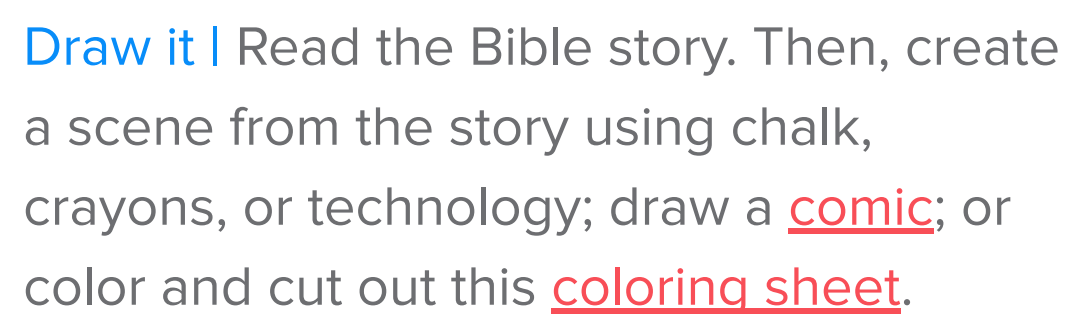
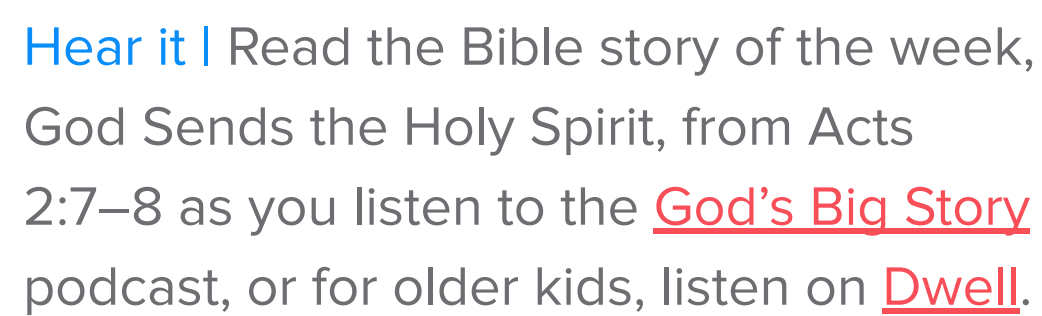
God Sends the Holy Spirit
