BIG TRUTH

Loving God means seeing Him as most valuable.

NOTE TO PARENTS

This past year, we have used our Timeline to walk through God's Big Story in the Bible.
This is the story of God and His people. It is the story of God rescuing His children and making a way for them to be with Him forever. It is the story that makes up the whole Bible.
The Bible is one book made up of hundreds of stories that all point to who God is and what He has done.

This summer, we will learn what it means to be a child of God. We will focus on how God wants to have a relationship with His children. The foundation of our lessons will be that faith is a free gift of God's grace; it is not something we deserve or can earn (Ephesians 2:8–9). We will learn that knowing God, leads us to love, trust, and obey Him as well!

After this week's lesson, ask:

- 1. What did you learn last week?

Read Ezekiel 36:26 as a family. Talk about which testament, book, chapter, and verse this passage is found in.

- 1. What does God give to His children so they can love Him with both emotions and actions?
 - God gives His children new hearts of flesh that are able to love God with their heart, mind, and soul.
- 2. Is it possible to love God without a new heart?

No, it is impossible to love God without a new heart. We are all born with hearts that have self at the center. We only want things that love and serve ourselves. But when God saves His children, He gives them new hearts with God at the center. God's children will love God.

Proclaiming the truth as you go

- Play "Love is..." Give everyone a blank piece of paper and have them write "Love is..." at the top. Then, spend some time writing or drawing what you think love is. When everyone is finished, talk about what you wrote/drew.
- Talk about actions versus emotions.
 We can love God with both our
 emotions and actions. Name some
 ways that we can show our love for
 God and identify it as either an action
 or emotion. Then, make a new list of
 how you can show love for others.
- At dinner, talk about what you love about each other. Go around and say one thing that you love about each other. Talk about how you can show your love to others.

SERVE How can you love your neighbor as yourself? Go on a walk in your neighborhood and talk about how you can show love to those that live around you. Make a plan to serve someone specifically; bake cookies, rake a yard, plant flowers, etc.

PRAY TOGETHER AS A FAMILY Praise
God that He wants to have a relationship
with His children. Thank Him for giving us
the free gift of faith. Confess that
sometimes we do not see God as most
valuable. Ask Him to help you love Him
more so that you can love others.
