God is Unchanging
Psalm 102:25–27

BIG TRUTH

God is unchanging.
He never changes.

NOTE TO PARENTS

This year, we are going to use our Timeline to walk through God's Big Story in the Bible. This is the story of God and His people. It is the story of God rescuing His children and making a way for them to be with Him forever. It is the story that makes up the whole Bible. The Bible is one book made up of thousands of stories that all point to who God is and what He has done.

As we walk through God's Big Story this year, we will learn some of God's attributes. An attribute is a word that tells us what someone or something is like. God tells us who He is and what He is like in the Bible, His true Word. Every story, person, place, and event in the Bible is true. Each week we will learn stories about God, and these stories will show us who God is.



TIME

Centering the home on God's Word

After watching the KV weekly video, ask:

1. Today you learned the word "attribute." What is an attribute? *A word that tells what someone or something is like*
2. What attribute of God did you learn about today? *God is unchanging.*
3. What does it mean for God to be unchanging? *He never changes.*
4. Unchanging is not an attribute that describes us. What are some ways that people change? *We get taller, learn more and more over time, grow old, change interests*
5. How does knowing that God is unchanging help us to trust Him? *As we see all of the changes happening in ourselves and in our world, it helps to know that God will not grow tired or weary of saving sinners and helping His children.*

Read 1 John 5:3 as a family. Talk about which testament, book, chapter, and verse this passage is found in.

1. What words in this passage do you not recognize or understand?
Commandment — instruction
Burdensome — hard
2. What are examples of things that might be burdensome? *Chores, schoolwork or homework, exercise*
3. What are some commandments we find in God's word? *Love God, love others, tell people about Jesus*
4. How do you feel about keeping or obeying God's commandments?
5. As a family, how can we encourage one another to know and keep God's commands?
6. As a family, how can we remind one another that God's commands are not burdensome?

MOMENTS

Proclaiming the truth as you go

- If kids are struggling with the change in their schedule, remember and talk about how God is unchanging! He is always good, wise, loving and generous.
- Measure your kids! If there's a place in your home where you already do that, talk about how they grow and change. Get out the baby pictures! Talk about how your kids have changed since they were born and all the good things you see God growing in them.
- At dinner, talk about the attributes of your food. Then, talk about the attributes of God that you know are true.

SERVE Write a letter to someone. Tell them why you love them and encourage them that God is unchanging and we can trust Him all of the time.

PRAY TOGETHER AS A FAMILY Praise God that He is unchanging! Thank Him for always staying the same and for letting you grow and change to be more like Him. Confess that change is sometimes hard and scary and you don't like to do it. Ask Him to help you know when change is necessary and see how it is for your good and His glory.
